Trust History

The history of Infinity Academies Trust began in 2012 when Gipsey Bridge was involved in a pioneering project to create a MAT with regional hubs in Rotherham, Sheffield and Leicester.

In 2013 Gipsey Bridge Academy academised alongside Greengate School in Sheffield. Later that year Lincolnshire LA asked Gipsey Bridge Academy to support Spilsby Primary. The three schools worked together but geography did not promote the most effective arrangements.

Spilsby Primary academised in 2016 whilst Greengate school was re-brokered to another Trust. Infinity Academies Trust now consisted of two Lincolnshire schools. The Trust formed a partnership with Kyra Teaching School and staff were designated as SLEs with the Trust Chair becoming an NLG.

In 2017, the Trust began to work with the Great Oaks Federation in Boston consisting of St Thomas CE Primary and Wyberton Primary. The Diocese and Trustees allowed Infinity to adopt the CofE Articles of Association to become a majority Church MAT. St Thomas and Wyberton academised as part of the Infinity Academies Trust in April 2019. The Executive Headteacher of Great Oaks became the CEO of the Trust.

In 2019 the RSC, Diocese and LA identified Infinity as a sponsor trust and St Nicholas CE Primary joined the MAT in September as a sponsored academy.

Currently the Trust consists of five schools each with a Headteacher or Head of Academy and has approximately 1150 pupils and nearly 175 staff.

We were pleased that in September 2018, OFSTED confirmed we were a Good school. We also became a Gold 'Rights and Respecting School', one of only seven schools in Lincolnshire to achieve this. Staff and pupils looked at equality and equity and how we need to achieve equity to meet the needs of the individual.

We changed the Behaviour Policy and this further strengthened the relationships in school. Relationships flourish through work with the British Council and using the platform of eTwinning. We were proud to show ten teachers from Beirut our small, rural school. Two of the teachers taught the children and staff in the school for two days, with a focus on traditional Arabic dance, stories, writing and speaking in Arabic. This will be remembered for its richness in culture, the developing of bonds and the fun experienced by all. They left a legacy which we continue to build on and develop. We are a small school that embraces the opportunities on offer to work and learn with others at staff and pupil level.

In November we had our first OFSTED visit as an academy who said we were a 'Good' school. During the year we had a strong focus on improving the social and emotional well-being of our children. This included normalising emotional language, introducing an emotion of the week into our whole school assemblies and well-being 'check ins' for each class. We were proud to be awarded the Well-being Award for Schools in January 2019- a national award for promoting positive mental health in schools. We were delighted with the performance of our year 6 children with 14% more children achieving the expected standard in Reading, writing and Maths. This year we want to continue to improve our children's progress in mathematics and ensure our curriculum reflects the children's needs in our school.

St Nicholas was delighted to become part of the Infinity Academies Trust in September 2019 and we are looking forward to working with colleagues across our Trust as we rapidly develop our school.

Last year our school made strong improvements which we will continue to build upon. Parents in the local community recognise our hard work and for the first time, the school is now full. We have welcomed a range of experienced staff to our school family and we were very pleased that Mrs Fiona Booth has become our Head of Academy. A school highlight was being part of the Church Schools Festival run by the Lincolnshire Diocese which had a focus on environmental issues. We also participated in the Boston Science and Technology project alongside five other local schools. This year we started an Academy Council which show British Values in practice and is proving extremely popular with the whole school community.

Developing our Staff

The Infinity Academies Trust believes that developing its staff is vital to ensuring that all children across our schools, achieve their very best.

We are delighted to work with initial teacher training providers so that aspiring teachers have the opportunity to train in our schools.

All teachers receive a strong core offer of support. This includes PPA time for both NQTs and RQTs. New staff have an induction to Infinity Academies Trust and all staff attend the Annual Trust conference and receive mentoring. We share good practice across the Trust through support with curriculum planning, a wide range of in-school training and cross-Trust moderation. We also encourage teachers and leaders to become Specialist Leaders in Education and Evidence Leads in Education so that they can support both schools in our Trust and other local schools.

Leaders receive additional support in their roles. We provide opportunities for staff to complete National Professional Qualifications through our local teaching schools. There are clusters for subject leads, senior leaders and Headteachers. We also look to offer excellence visits to Infinity Academies and to other schools.

We aim to ensure that staff have the opportunity to develop their careers at Infinity Academies Trust.

Supporting Governance

During the growth of the Infinity Academies Trust it has been important to ensure the governance structures are fit for purpose to support the improvement in our schools.

The model has developed from the original governing bodies of our schools to our current position of having a Trust Board and each individual school has their own Academy Development Committee. We ensure there are close links between the Trust board and our schools. The scheme of delegation gives all governors and trustees clarity over the roles so that time is best spent in providing the very best for the children across our Trust.

There is considerable expertise within our Trust including a National Leader of Governance and a Local Leader of Governance who actively support and train our Academy Development Committees. They also work closely with local teaching schools to work with a range of governing bodies across Lincolnshire to provide both Governance Reviews and Pupil Premium Reviews. These skills have proved particularly important as St Nicholas CE Primary Academy joined the Trust so that leaders could smoothly integrate the school. They have been able to quickly focus on the improvement agenda.
